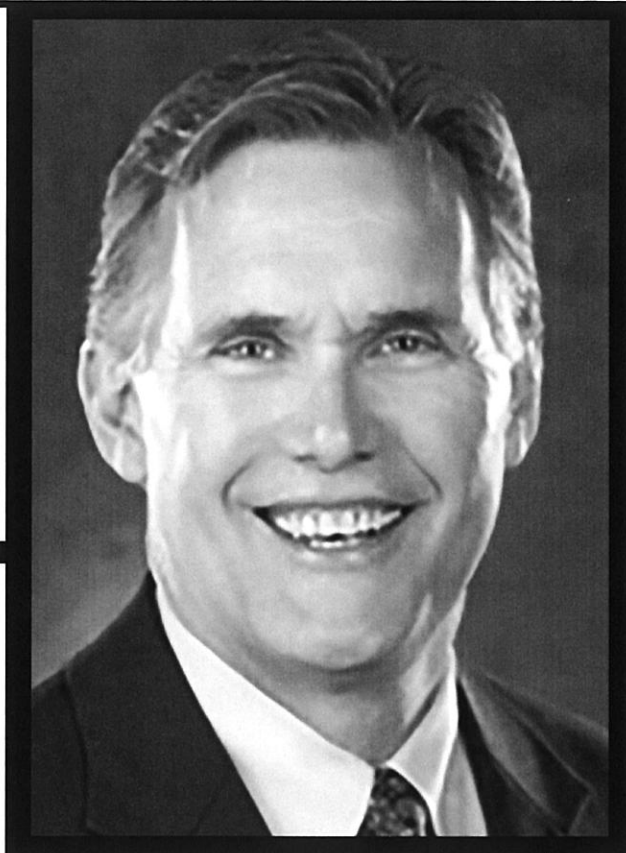


# HALL OF FAME



## Distinguished Alumnus

### Terry Witt, M.D.

Dr. Terry Witt, a 1975 New Prague graduate, has had a distinguished medical career. After graduating from St. John's University and completing medical school at the University of MN, he volunteered at a hospital and refugee camp in Africa during a historic famine. He also provided medical care to the underserved in the Tacoma, WA area. He went on to work for the Central Intelligence Agency in Washington, D.C. as the Chief of the Physical Medicine Division of the Office of Medical Services. He served 18 years doing tours in South America, Europe, Asia, Africa and the Asia-Pacific providing primary medical care to agency officers, families and associates. Upon retirement from the CIA in 2012, he was awarded the CIA Career Intelligence Medal, which is awarded to less than 1% of retirees. Dr. Witt, a member of the American Academy of Family Physicians, has served as Core Faculty Member, Mayo Clinic Family Medicine Residency in Eau Claire, WI and also as a member of the Mayo Clinic Opioid Stewardship Program Oversight Group, leading national efforts to improve the safety of patients using chronic opioid therapy. He has served his local community as a volunteer physician for area shelters and free clinics in WI. Dr. Witt and his wife, Elizabeth, a registered nurse, have three children, Rachel, Daniel and Joel, all trained in the medical field. Dr. Witt is the son of Anna Mae and Werner Witt, who emphasized the importance of family, education and serving others.
